
# Innovation policy paradigm

- They are also necessary to ensure international competitiveness of Finnish economy and enterprises
- The aim of innovation policy is to encourage companies for bold innovation, international growth and renewal.
- Broad based innovation policy:
  - promotion of non-technological innovations (f.ex services, design, work life innovation, innovation in the public sector)
  - supporting growth enterprises and finding new business opportunities in responses to global challenges
  - Addressing societal challenges
- Innovations often emerge from combinations of different competencies and at the interfaces of different fields.
